 Kindergarten ratios are 20:1, increase up to 28:1 at 5th grade. 	
 Currently projected to have 437 for next year, 49 less than October 2021 headcount. If 	
school falls below 451, it will start to affect our core staffing allotment. With current	
enrollment projections Bryant is allotted for 19 teachers, down from 23.	
Review will happen again in June.
