


- Communicate to the PTSA board: state level ed leg/budget activities, relevant SPS decisions, and regional PTSA activities (ongoing)
- Continue advocacy and identify SPS/School
 Board policy processes to promote full funding and staffing and critical programming, including advocating for:
 - FTAP
 - SPS program resources- enrollment promotion resources and building usage
 for community engagement efforts and safety resources (fall follow up to SBD Hampson, WSS model update cycle winter)

- Advocate for increased SPS resources through the upcoming state education budget proposal (January/Feb 2023, Washington State Legislature 2023 session)
- Help ID and vocalize community needs to school administration; including Caregiver survey issues (fall) and coordinate community-based advocacy resources; e.g. letter writing advocacy (over the year)
- ID discretionary SPS decisions and advocate where possible and help communicate with the org to promote the interests of the school and district (as needed)
